A New Transportation Opportunity for Patients in Santa Clara County

American Cancer Society provides a non-emergency patient transport vehicle and driver for 40 hours per week, 8 hours per day Monday through Friday. Drivers will go through training on HIPAA Compliance, do a 7-year background check, defensive driver training, 10 year DMV history check, hospital/facility map training, DMV driver automatic pull-notice program, random drug and alcohol testing, injury/illness prevention, safety training, customer service training, CPR/first aid and sexual harassment training. American Cancer Society will provide this service in Santa Clara County for 6 months. If successful, the program may continue based on funding.

To request a ride, patients must contact the American Cancer Society at 1-800-227-2345 a minimum of four (4) business days' notice in advance of the date that the ride is needed. This allows coordination with the volunteer drivers as rides are dependent upon availability.
